



## Masonic Digital Library

Most Research Lodges in New Zealand participate in a shared digital library, consisting largely of papers printed in their Transactions. Access is restricted to members of participating lodges. The library currently includes over 5,500 files.

Files cover a wide range of subjects, and can be searched by word or phrase – for example a search on “Apron” gives many files with Apron in the title.

As well as Transactions, the library contains a number of files relating to the early history of Freemasonry in New Zealand, scripts for demonstrations of degree workings from the 1600’s, extracts from early New Zealand Masonic Magazines, and lectures from past Grand Lecturers.

The library will be of interest to lodge historians, researchers, and writers of lodge newsletters, but in particular provides any member of a participating Research Lodge to gain a quick review of past work on many issues of interest to Freemasons, and the way in which others have explained masonic issues and answered questions.

There is no cost for either participation or access, but most files should not be copied without approval from the publishing Research Lodge.
