A SYSTEM OF MORALITY - Aristotle and English Masonic Ritual

From the NZ Masonic Forum Season of Zoom Lectures 2020
Presented by **W Bro Dr George Boys-Stones**, Prestonian Lecturer 2020



It is well known that William Preston (1742-1818) had an important impact on English masonic ritual, but less well appreciated how deep his influence goes. This Prestonian lecture shows that it is to Preston that we owe the very definition of Freemasonry as a 'system of morality', and that he used this phrase to mean that Freemasonry embodies a philosophical approach to ethics. Inspired by his reading of Aristotle, Preston argued that the three degrees address in turn practical, intellectual, and contemplative virtue, to give a complete account of human excellence.



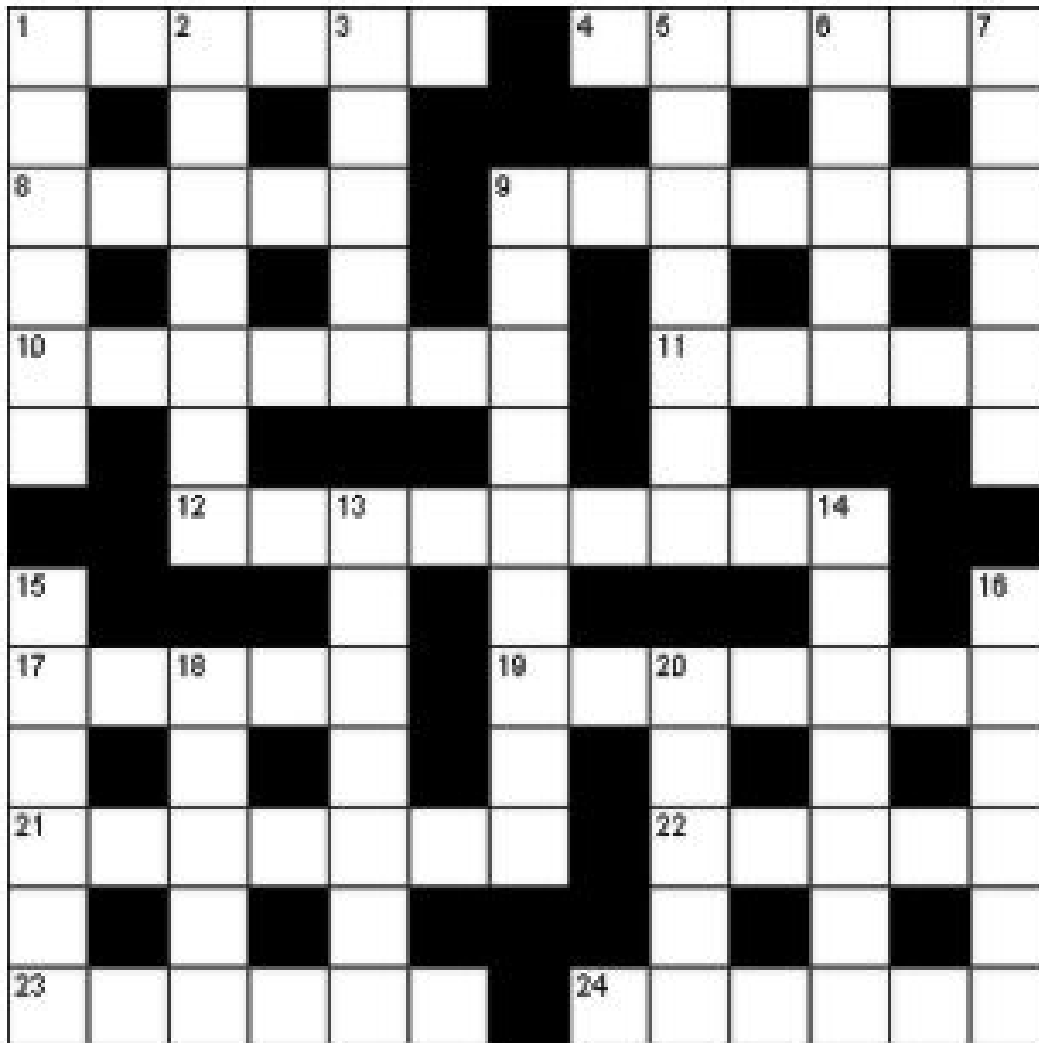
George Boys-Stones is Professor of Classics and Philosophy at the University of Toronto. He studied at Cambridge (MA, LittD), and Oxford (DPhil) where he was initiated into the Apollo University Lodge no. 357. He holds Grand Rank in the United Grand Lodge of England (as PAGDC) and in Supreme Grand Chapter (as PGStB), and belongs to a number of other English Masonic orders, including the Ancient and Accepted Rite, Knights Templar, Mark Master Masons, and Royal Ark Mariners.
