Small Town Freemasonry In Early New Zealand

From 1837 when the first Masonic Lodge meeting in New Zealand was held in Port Levy under a warrant issued by the Grand Orient of France, something of a Masonic wild west prevailed. A total of 186 Lodges were constituted under charters issued by the Grand Orient of France, Grand Lodge of Ireland, The United Grand Lodge of England, and the Grand Lodge of Scotland. Many of these Lodges sprang up in small towns where people had settled to mine for gold, build railway lines, follow the military forces, and provide the infrastructure for the town. Several Masonic charters were applied for and then returned unused to the respective Constitutions as the town simply disappeared off the map. Join us to learn how Freemasonry helped build New Zealand from a simple, distance colony of Great Britain to what it is today.

John MacDonald needs no introduction to New Zealand Freemasons as a very active Mason, researcher, presenter and Lecturer. His talks are always lively and entertaining.
